In a year's time we will:

Take a stroll through magnificent gardens;  
Take a ride on an animal filled vessel;  
be betrayed by family and thrown into a pit;  
witness passionate love affairs;  
wander in the desert;  
discover a new home;  
go to war with neighboring countries;  
make peace;  
build a new place of worship;  
witness a most humble birth;  
walk alongside the dregs of society;  
walk on and then sink in a lake  
lock ourselves in an upper room;  
live through strong winds;  
be thrown into prison;

and through it all be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit.

How will we do all these things in a year? Well, that's where the invitation and challenge lies. **We're going to read the Whole Bible in ONE YEAR!**

In reading the stories of God's activity in the world which are found in Scripture we will re-live the events that formed God's people, our ancestors in the faith.

The Faith Formation Council has adopted the program, *The Year of the Bible*, to help us in this endeavor.

The Bible is the book that is basic to our faith. This is the book that has sustained millions and millions of Christians throughout their lives. This is the book that points us to God's activity in the world and the book in which we see that to be a disciple of Jesus the Christ is to be a servant of all.

As each member of Fairmount seeks to be a minister it is important that we nurture our faith so that we remember who we are as children of God and how we are called to live in the world.

Many people say they do not know the Bible very well. We hope to change that in the coming year. It may sound like an imposing task to read the entire Bible in

one year, but it can be done much more easily than you may suspect. It takes only fifteen to twenty minutes per day to do the readings. Of course it takes some energy to plan the reading time into your daily schedule, but that can be done and it helps to know that you will

not be alone in this adventure. Your entire church family will be right there alongside of you. You are not on your own!

Whether your Bible is a well worn part of your daily life or another book on your shelf we hope you will join us for this exciting adventure as all of us together read through the pages of the Scriptures in this way. We are sure you will find this to be enriching and stimulating for your life as a disciple of Jesus Christ.

In the coming months you will see opportunities to sign up to participate in the Year of the Bible here at Fairmount. We hope between now and then you will prayerfully consider committing to this journey.

## About the Lord's Prayer

Fairmount uses two versions of the Lord's Prayer: the traditional Presbyterian version and an ecumenical version developed by the International Consultation on Ecumenical Texts over 30 years ago. We use these two versions mindfully, to connect us both with our Presbyterian roots, and with the global ecumenical Church of which Presbyterians are one family. But we also realize that prayer transcends reason; we want to pray "by heart."

To help us memorize both versions, we will use the traditional version November through April, and the ecumenical version May through October.

The housing provided by the New Life Community program is composed 15 fully furnished apartment units. Fairmount is now a sponsor of apartment # 6. A sponsor makes a 1 year commitment to provide a new family with household items every 16 weeks (3 times a year). The items that are most needed for the current set up include:
