## From Your Pastor

I've just finished reading *Let the Great World Spin*, and I cannot get it out of my mind. 2009 National Book Award winner, it is a stunning evocation of a city and a time on a Summer day in 1974 when Philippe Petit strung heavy cable between the twin towers of the World Trade Center and tightroped across it. With language at turns lyrical and gritty, author Colum McCann portrays the interconnections of the people on the streets below—"the [ordinary people] who walk a tightrope just one inch off the ground"--- inhabiting each with a distinctive voice and pitch-perfect emotional timbre. Of course the towers now invoke the horrors of 9/11 and the wrenching new world of insecurity in which we live.

McCann took the title of his book from a poem by Alfred, Lord Tennyson:

*Not in vain the distance beckons. Forward, forward let us range,  
Let the great world spin forever down the ringing grooves of change.*

The Summer of 2010 beckons and will no doubt bring change. I hope it also offers opportunities for relaxation and restoration, be it time on the golf course or "North Coast," vacation or "stay-cation," lazy evenings with family and friends, cheering on the Tribe (though I'm sorry we didn't have the Cavs longer!), or doing whatever renews your body and soul. May I suggest one more thing? Let's vow to receive each day as God's gift, and resolve to notice God in every single moment. Rather than retreating from worship, come and be nourished by God's Word and the companionship of others. Seek a more vital relationship with God as **Dick Clewell** leads us in a series of discussions of *Rediscovering the Heart of Christianity: Living a Life of Faith* by the always-engaging Marcus Borg. Bring your family to worship (at 10) for a special children's church school class "Baobab Blast," nurturing faith in a fun learning environment. The slower pace of Summer may open a window to minister and serve. Check out worship options in the places to which you travel this Summer—I'd love to see bulletins and other materials from these faith communities when you return.

So, forward, forward let us range! Whether near at hand or far from home, we can trust the One who forever holds the great spinning world in loving and protective arms.

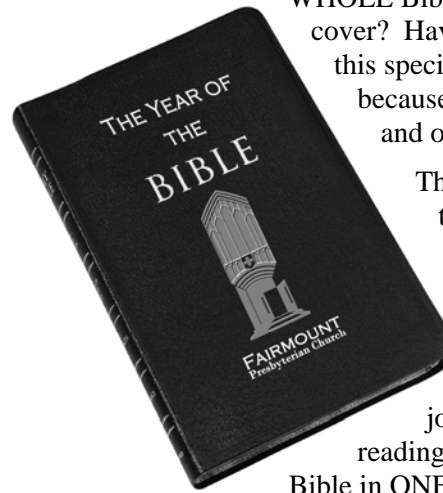
### "You Asked For It" Returns

## Clerk's Corner

Your Session wrestles with three primary issues: how do we make our ministry more meaningful to the lives of Fairmount members, friends, and regular visitors; how do we make our ministry more real for those outside our walls; and how do we adjust to the changes in the world around us that impel our response without losing our distinctive

foundational values? These three central points of reference blossom into many tributaries once we recognize the many dimensions of ministry: worshipping together, service to others inside and outside the building, fellowship, and faith generation and nourishment. And these tributaries flow into still other streams when we recognize that faith is nurtured in distinctive ways for different

people. What serves as a source of spiritual growth for one person may not be helpful to others, and what is important to one person in communal worship may actually be a barrier to worship by others.

It is not surprising, therefore, that sometimes we may seem to be working at cross purposes. Is the Every Member a Minister initiative subtracting from our ability to minister to each other? Are the dual doxologies or different versions of the Lord's Prayer actually diluting our central and traditional focus? Does the hymn that someone else likes crowd out the hymns that I like? Will a contemporary

service reduce our commitment to the traditional service?

These are issues of all to consider. We can address such issues successfully if we develop an increasingly appreciative community, one where we appreciate an aspect of our church that is important to another even if it is not

the aspect that is important to us. When that happens, the parts of church life that are important to some members of the community are not necessarily seen as a loss by another member of the community. Such an appreciative community requires constant communication and constant balance between individual preferences and community

preferences. It is a matter of listening, discerning, and balancing. We all must listen to many voices and then listen to the One Voice that allows us to understand ministry as the interacting, interconnecting process that enriches us as individuals by enriching us as part of a vibrant faith community. May we all be faithful listeners as we seek to grow our community within and outside our walls, in numbers and in individual spiritual richness.
